#### **BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:**

Staff will present a summary of revenue forecasts for fiscal year 2025 and fiscal year 2026, with an emphasis on the General Fund.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Staff have done initial revenue forecasting for the fiscal year 2025 and fiscal year 2026 budgets. The general trends are as follows:

- Overall revenues Revenues are expected to increase from \$21,887,439 in fiscal year 2024 to \$22,277,825 in fiscal year 2025 and \$22,821,725 in fiscal year 2026. This represents a 1.8% increase in fiscal year 2025 and 2.4% increase in fiscal year 2026.
- General fund property tax is anticipated to increase 3% each year. Final amounts will not be known until June 2024 (2025).
- Sales tax has historically grown at a rapid pace (24% average increase from fiscal year 2019 to fiscal year 2023). However, the City has seen a slowdown in sales tax receipts and is anticipating lethargic growth of 2% in fiscal year 2025 and 3% in fiscal year 2026.
- A few general fund revenue sources are expected to decrease. This includes: Court fines (24%), interest income (79%), and passports (8%).

Staff are anticipating property tax revenue in the Herriman City Safety Enforcement Area to increase 3% annually in fiscal years 2025 and 2026. This equates to an additional \$270K in revenue during fiscal year 2025 and \$278K in fiscal year 2026.



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The Herriman City Fire Service Area will begin tax participation agreements with 3 renewal project areas in fiscal year 2025. This will result in a \$686K decrease in revenue in fiscal year 2025.

The water fund is currently undergoing a water rate study. City staff are still working on internal revenue projections. Fiscal year 2023 actuals increased 5.3% and fiscal year 2024 actuals year-to-date increased 4.4%.

The storm water fund anticipates a 4% revenue increase in fiscal year 2025 and a 3% revenue increase in fiscal year 2026. This will generate an additional \$59K in revenue for fiscal year 2025 and \$35K in revenue for fiscal year 2026.
